



## **Connecticut Convention Guide**

### **District Convention**

The number of delegates and alternatives is based on if they are located in a congressional, assembly or senatorial district. Check with local officials to find out how many delegates your district is allowed.

### **Qualifications**

- Enrolled Republican Electors residing within the district they wish to represent

### **Process**

- Endorsement of all district delegates will be made by all enrolled members of the Republican Party present and voting at a caucus or they can be endorsed by the Town Committee, if local rules allow
- Delegates may be voted in individually or on a slate

### **State Convention**

A town will have a minimum of two delegates. The number of delegates is based on many different factors check with local officials to see how many delegates your town is allowed

### **Qualifications**

- Enrolled Republican Electors residing within the district they wish to represent

### **Process**

- Endorsement of all district delegates will be made by all enrolled members of the Republican Party present and voting at a caucus or they can be endorsed by the Town Committee, if local rules allow
- Delegates may be voted in individually or on a slate
- Delegates will be deemed as lawfully chosen or elected when:
  - No opposition slate has qualified
  - Delegate was elected at a primary or
  - Otherwise elected in accordance with the law
