



Indiana

In Indiana there is a precinct committee composed of two delegates, the precinct committeeman and the precinct vice-committeeman. There is not a gender rule for the delegates. Precinct committeemen serve a term of four years and are elected in the Primary Election.

Requirements

- Must be a qualified elector of the precinct and a registered Republican voter of that precinct.
- Must have cast a Republican Party ballot at the individual's most recent vote at a primary election.

Process

- Running as an official candidate
 - Must file a declaration of candidacy, which must be notarized, for the primary with the County Clerk no later than noon seventy-four (74) days and no earlier than one hundred and four (104) days before the primary election.
 - After winning election they need to appoint a vice-committeeman from someone who meets the same requirements as the committeeperson did.
- Filling a vacancy
 - When a vacancy occurs in the elected precinct committeeman positions the County Chairman shall appoint an individual to fill the position.
 - If a vacancy occurs within the vice-precinct committeeperson position then the elected precinct committeeperson may appoint, in writing to the County Chairman and the State Party Secretary, a person to fill the vacancy within the first seven (7) days of the vacancy. If the precinct committeeperson fails to appoint someone then the County Chairman may fill the vacancy.
