



## **South Carolina Convention Guide**

### **County Convention**

County Conventions shall occur every non-general election year in the month of April no less than fourteen (14) days after the precinct reorganizational meetings. Members of the County Convention are elected at the local Precinct Conventions. The County Convention is responsible for electing delegates and alternates to the District and State Conventions.

### **Qualifications**

- Eligible to participate in the Precinct meeting held before the County Convention.
- Need to be a registered Republican voter residing within the county

### **Process**

- Must be elected as a delegate or alternate at the Precinct meeting by a majority vote

### **State Convention**

The State Convention is to meet during May in every non-general election year, and after the presidential preference primary, and no less than five (5) days after the District Convention, in presidential election years. Delegates to the State Convention shall be elected at the County Convention, one delegate for every 6,000 residents in the county plus two additional delegates.

### **Qualifications**

- Need to be a registered Republican residing in the county you represent
- Need to be elected as a delegate or alternate at the County Convention

### **Process**

- Elected at the County Convention by majority vote
- Need to attend the District Convention between the County and State Convention
